by establishing habits which promote safety for the rest of their lives, and extend beyond child safety seats and seat belts to include

good safety habits for young pedestrians and bicyclists; and

**WHEREAS,** parents and guardians should make sure children age 13 and under

always ride in the back seat, buckled up or in properly installed child safety seats, and stay in a rear facing child seat until at least

age 2; and

WHEREAS, child passenger protection laws require proper restraints for

younger children and safety belt use by older children.
