WHEREAS, myelin oligodendrocyte glycoprotein antibody-associated disease (MOGAD) is a rare and relatively unknown autoimmune disease which currently has no cure; and WHEREAS, MOGAD attacks the central nervous system and can cause lifetime disability, including blindness and/or paralysis; and the cause of MOGAD is still a mystery, and there are currently no WHEREAS, FDA-approved treatments for patients with MOGAD; and when mistaken for other diseases, treatments can exacerbate WHEREAS, MOGAD symptoms; and increasing awareness about MOGAD has caused diagnoses to rise, WHEREAS, as doctors have become more likely to recognize the varying manifestations of the disease; and WHEREAS, the MOGAD community is dedicated to increasing awareness and understanding of this disease in order to promote research, improve patient care and outcomes, and ultimately find a cure. NOW, THEREFORE, I, Philip B. Scott, Governor, hereby proclaim April 2023 as
