WHEREAS,	the Bald Eagle v	was de	esignated as th	ne United	d States'	National Embl	em on June 20, 1782 by

our country's founding fathers at the Second Continental Congress; and

WHEREAS, the Bald Eagle is the central image used in the Great Seal of the United States, and in the

logos of many branches of the U.S. Government, including the Presidency and Congress;

and

WHEREAS, the Bald Eagle's image, meaning and symbolism have played a significant role in the

beliefs, traditions, lifestyles and heritage of Americans from all walks of life; and

WHEREAS, the Bald Eagle's image, meaning and symbolism have played a significant role in American

art, music, literature, architecture, commerce, education, culture; and

WHEREAS, the Bald Eagle was once endangered with possible extinction, and is making a gradual and

encouraging comeback to America's skies; and

WHEREAS, the Bald Eagle was federally classified as an "endangered species" in the lower 48 states

under the Endangered Species Act of 1973, and was upgraded to a less imperiled

"threatened" status under the act in 1995; and

WHEREAS, the Department of the Interior and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service delisted the Bald Eagle

from Endangered Species Act protection in 2007, but will continue to be protected under

the Bald & Golden Eagle Protection Act and the Migratory Bird Treaty Act; and

WHEREAS, the recovery of the United States Bald Eagle population was largely accomplished due to

the vigilant efforts of numerous caring agencies, corporations, organizations and citizens;

and

WHEREAS, nesting Bald Eagles were absent from Vermont from the 1940s through 2008, but

populations have since grown to at least 37 nesting pairs; and

WHEREAS, twenty-nine eaglets were translocated to and fledged in Vermont at Dead Creek Wildlife

Management Area from 2003-2006; and

WHEREAS, Bald Eagles were listed as endangered in Vermont in 1987, and due to their strong recovery

are currently under consideration for delisting in the state.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Philip B. Scott, Governor, hereby proclaim June 20, 2023 as

AMERICAN EAGLE DAY

in Vermont.
