WHEREAS,	January 27, 2024, is International Holocaust Remembrance Day, and marks the 79 th anniversary of the liberation of the Auschwitz concentration camp; and
WHEREAS,	Holocaust Remembrance Day honors the tragic loss of over six million Jews who were ethnically cleansed by Nazi Germany between 1933 and 1945; and
WHEREAS,	anti-Semitic rhetoric and behaviors have risen sharply since the October 7, 2023, terrorist attack on Israel by Hamas; and
WHEREAS,	Vermont is committed to combatting the recent rise in global anti-Semitism; and
WHEREAS,	anti-Semitic rhetoric and behaviors are an assault on the humanity of all Vermonters; and
WHEREAS,	we must take time to remember the millions of men, women, and children who were slaughtered simply because their beliefs and heritage; and
WHEREAS,	Vermont must continue to work to eradicate bigotry, prejudice, and injustice through education and vigilance; and
WHEREAS,	Vermont stands united in condemning acts of anti-Semitism and hatred, and we must vow that the atrocities and genocide of the Holocaust never be repeated.
NOW, THEREFORE,	I, Philip B. Scott, Governor, hereby proclaim the 27th day of January, 2024, as
