**WHEREAS,** serious illness, accident or injury can happen to anyone at any time

regardless of health status; and

**WHEREAS**, it is in everyone's best interest to have their goals and values known

at times of incapacity and at end-of-life; and

**WHEREAS,** based on recommendations from the Attorney General's End-of-

Life Task Force, the Vermont General Assembly passed a

comprehensive Advance Directive Law in 2005; and

WHEREAS, a component of Vermont's Advance Directive Law was the

establishment of the Vermont Advance Directive Registry in 2007;

and

**WHEREAS,** the Advance Directive Registry is an important tool for making an

individual's documents immediately available to health care providers in need of information about critical health decisions and

end-of-life wishes through an electronic database; and

WHEREAS, by completing an advanced directive, Vermonters are able to

communicate their health care goals, preferences and priorities in

advance of a health crisis.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** I, Philip B. Scott, Governor, do hereby proclaim April 16-21, 2017

as

in Vermont.
