wounds, and that number is expected to grow at more than two

percent annually for the next decade; and

WHEREAS, the rising incidence is fueled by an aging population and increasing

rates of disease and conditions such as diabetes, obesity, and the

late effects of radiation therapy; and

untreated chronic wounds can lead to diminished quality of life and WHEREAS,

> possibly amputation of the affected limb, and where the chronic wound epidemic represents a cost of more than \$50 billion to the

healthcare system; and

WHEREAS, more than 29.1 million people, 9.5 percent of the population, have

> diabetes in the United States, and almost two million of those people will develop a diabetic foot ulcer or another non-healing

wound; and

WHEREAS, advanced wound care aims to prevent amputations and heal patients

in a faster and more cost-effective way; and

wound care physicians and health care providers take great pride in WHEREAS,

caring for their patients, and seeing their patients succeed; and

the goal of Wound Care Awareness Week is to inform patients, WHEREAS,

> their families, community physicians and the public about the importance of advanced wound care its ability to save and limbs

and lives.
