WHEREAS, an estimated 20 million American workers use respirators every day

to protect against potential job hazards – from doctors and nurses to firefighters, first-responders, coal miners, and agriculture

workers; and

WHEREAS, many of these workers depend on particulate filtering facepiece

respirators when working in environments with hazardous airborne

particles; and

WHEREAS, as part of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the

National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) is the federal agency responsible for testing and approving respirators;

and

WHEREAS, NIOSH has established N95 Day to emphasize the importance of

property using NIOSH-approved N95 filtering facepiece

respirators; and

WHEREAS, NIOSH-approved N95 filtering facepiece respirators filter 95

percent of particles and significantly reduce the wearer's risk of inhaling hazardous airborne particles from dangerous chemicals,

dust, metal fumes and many infectious diseases; and

WHEREAS, the most effective emergency preparedness is proper use every day;

and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Philip B. Scott, Governor, do hereby proclaim September 5, 2017

as

N95 DAY

in Vermont.
