WHEREAS, one blood donation can help up to three patients, and although an

estimated 38 percent of the U.S. population is eligible to donate blood,

less than 10 percent actually do; and

WHEREAS, Vermont is home to a number of public service and private

organizations working to raise awareness about the importance of

blood donation, including the American Red Cross; and

WHEREAS, Vermont Blood Donation Day effectively serves to remind us that we

need to constantly replenish our blood supply through donation and

community awareness.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** I, Philip B. Scott, Governor, do hereby proclaim September 8, 2017 as

in Vermont, and call this observance to the attention of all our citizens.
