WHEREAS, by retaining older workers, employers will maintain their skills,

knowledge, experience, and relationships; and

WHEREAS, older workers bring to the workplace values such as responsibility

and dedication, and play a role as mentors to younger employees;

WHEREAS, Vermont Associates for Training and Development Inc., through its

Senior Community Service Employment Program, and the Vermont Department for Disabilities, Aging and Independent Living are committed to promoting the benefits of employing older workers as well as providing job training opportunities for older individuals.
