## State of Vermont Executive Department A Proclamation

WHEREAS, Vermont is committed to ensuring the safety and security of all

those living in and visiting the state; and

**WHEREAS,** fire departments across the United States responded to 365,500

home fires in 2015; and

**WHEREAS,** home fires in the United States claimed an average of 3,062

civilians annually between 2011 and 2015, representing the majority (78 percent) of all fire deaths in the United States; and

**WHEREAS**, many of today's products and furnishings produce toxic gases and

smoke when burned, making it impossible to see and breathe within

moments; and

**WHEREAS.** these toxic conditions can leave as little as one or two minutes for

occupants to escape a home from the time the smoke alarm sounds, making the installation of smoke alarms critical for early warning;

and

**WHEREAS,** a home fire escape plan provides the skill set and know-how to

quickly and safely escape a home fire situation; and

**WHEREAS,** a proper home fire escape plan includes two exits from every room

in the home, a path to the outside from each exit, smoke alarms in all required locations, and a meeting place outside where everyone

in the home will convene upon exiting; and

WHEREAS, Vermont's first responders are dedicated to reducing the occurrence

of home fires and home fire injuries through prevention, protection

and public education; and

**WHEREAS,** the Vermont Division of Fire Safety and local fire departments are

working in coordination with the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), the official sponsor of Fire Prevention Week for more than 90 years, to educate the public about these life-saving

messages; and

WHEREAS, Vermonters are responsive to public education measures and are

able to take personal steps to increase their safety from fire,

especially in their homes; and

WHEREAS,

National Fire Prevention Week is October 8 through October 14, 2017 and its theme, "Every Second Counts: Plan 2 Ways Out!" effectively serves to educate the public about the vital importance of developing a home fire escape plan with all members of the household and practicing it twice a year.
