A Proclamation

WHEREAS, Vermont mentoring programs, Mobius, and other public and private organizations throughout Vermont are committed to working collaboratively to increase the number of quality mentoring matches statewide; and

WHEREAS, since 2013, Mobius has served as Vermont's Mentoring Partnership, and is committed to closing the mentoring gap by providing support for youth mentoring programs and volunteer mentors throughout Vermont.


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Philip B. Scott, Governor, do hereby proclaim January 2018 as


MENTORING MONTH
