WHEREAS, the Grange provides service to agriculture and rural areas on a wide

variety of issues including economic development, education, family endeavors, and legislation designed to assure a strong and

viable Rural America; and

WHEREAS, formed in the years following the Civil War to unite private citizens

in improving the economic and social position of the nation's farm population, the Grange now includes non-farm rural individuals and families in strengthening our communities and providing a social gathering place for activities and recreation, a place to develop skills for a lifetime, and a family-oriented organization that

provides lifetime membership.
