WHEREAS, Vermont proudly recognizes the dedication and service provided by these emergency communication professionals who dedicate themselves to helping others; and

WHEREAS, while this week is designated for Public Safety Telecommunicators, their service should always be held in the highest regard, for their commitment and hard work every day.
