WHEREAS, 60 percent of Vermont adults and 29 percent of Vermont youth are

overweight or obese; and

WHEREAS, poor nutrition and lack of physical activity are leading to epidemic

rates of obesity, and it is estimated medical expenses attributable to

adult obesity in Vermont total \$291 million annually; and

WHEREAS, physical activity reduces risk, at all ages, of obesity, heart disease,

high blood pressure and diabetes; and

WHEREAS, participation in sports and all kinds of active pastimes can help

improve physical and mental wellbeing; and

WHEREAS, the Vermont Governor's Council on Physical Fitness and Sports,

Department of Health, other state agencies, and private and nonprofit organizations establish opportunities for physical activity in worksites, schools, and communities throughout the state and provide opportunities for all people to enjoy physical activity on a

regular basis; and

WHEREAS, the month of May is traditionally recognized as National Physical

Fitness and Sports Month to encourage the broad promotion of and

participation in physical fitness activities.
