connected by the streams, rivers, lakes and ponds that flow to our

downstream neighbors; and

goals to protect and restore clean water statewide; and

**WHEREAS,** protecting our lakes, rivers, and wetlands represents a direct investment

in our well-being and our future; and

**WHEREAS,** clean water is essential to sustaining our quality of life and the economic

prosperity of Vermont by supporting a robust tourism and recreation economy, attracting new businesses and residents to the state, providing

for safe drinking water, and maintaining property values; and

**WHEREAS,** the establishment of an annual Clean Water Week inspires within us a

generations.
