to this day, the Vermont Fish & Wildlife Department is funded WHEREAS,

> primarily by sportsmen and women, through this American System of Conservation Funding, a "user pays – public benefits" approach, which is widely recognized as the most successful model of fish

and wildlife management in the world; and

WHEREAS, last year alone, Vermont's sportsmen and women generated \$15.6

million through this system to support the conservation efforts of

the Vermont Fish & Wildlife Department; and

Vermont's 191,567 hunters and anglers support the state's WHEREAS,

economy through spending more than \$425 million annually while

engaged in their pursuits; and

National Hunting and Fishing Day was established in 1972 to WHEREAS,

> celebrate and recognize hunters and anglers for their immense contributions to fish and wildlife conservation, and to our society.
