> members, Vermont Rotarians raise more than one million dollars each year for local and international causes and invest many hours of personal

time to service projects; and

since 1985, Rotary has led a coalition of charities and nongovernmental WHEREAS,

organizations to immunize millions of children each year against polio, at

the cost of billions of dollars and millions of service hours; and

WHEREAS, poliomyelitis (polio) is a highly infectious disease that primarily affects

> children under 5 years of age, and as of 1988, polio was infecting approximately 350,000 people each year in many countries around the

world: and

cases of poliomyelitis due to wild polio virus have decreased by more WHEREAS,

than 99% since 1988; and

WHEREAS, Rotary and its partners are on the cusp of eradicating polio from the earth

as recent years have seen only a handful of new cases.
