



- WHEREAS,** Vermont 9-1-1 call takers provide the first critical contact for those in need of emergency services, serve as the first of the first responders, and must ascertain the location, nature and extent of an emergency, often under stressful conditions; and
- WHEREAS,** during a crisis and under high pressure, Vermont 9-1-1 call takers exhibit compassion, skill and professionalism as they carry out the vital work of responding to emergency requests for assistance; and
- WHEREAS,** Vermont proudly recognizes the dedication and service provided by all those involved in making sure Vermonters and visitors have an efficient and reliable means of obtaining help during an emergency through our statewide 9-1-1 system; and
- WHEREAS,** ten Vermonters serving as 9-1-1 call takers are celebrating 20 years of saving lives.
