**WHEREAS,** there are over 1,200 dedicated licensed foster and kinship foster families in Vermont who often adopt foster children; and

**WHEREAS,** there are numerous individuals, as well as public and private organizations, who work to increase public awareness of children's needs who are currently in or leaving foster care; and

**WHEREAS,** we honor the enduring and valuable contributions of foster, kinship foster and adoptive parents, and so many others who make the foster care system the supportive network it is.
