## State of Vermont Executive Department A Proclamation

WHEREAS, as many as 32 million Americans have food allergies; nearly 6

million are children under the age of 18; and

WHEREAS, research shows that the prevalence of food allergy is increasing

among children and adults; and

**WHEREAS,** eight foods cause the majority of all food allergy reactions in the

United States: shellfish, fish, milk, eggs, tree nuts, peanuts, soy, and wheat, and symptoms of a food-allergic reaction can range from

mild to severe; and

**WHEREAS**, food allergy results in more than 200,000 emergency department

visits each year, and reactions typically occur when an individual unknowingly eats a food containing an ingredient to which they are

allergic; and

**WHEREAS,** the number of food allergy reactions requiring emergency treatment

is up sharply over the past decade; and

**WHEREAS,** anaphylaxis is a serious allergic reaction that is rapid in onset and

may cause death; and

**WHEREAS,** Food Allergy Research & Education (FARE) is a national, nonprofit

organization dedicated to improving the quality of life and the health of individuals with food allergies, and to provide them hope through

the promise of new treatments.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** I, Philip B. Scott, Governor, hereby proclaim May 12 – 18, 2019 as
