significant difficulty learning to speak and is among the most

severe speech deficits in children; and

WHEREAS, the act of learning to speak comes effortlessly to most

children, but those with apraxia endure a lengthy struggle; and

WHEREAS, without appropriate speech therapy intervention, children with

apraxia are placed at high risk for secondary impacts in reading, writing, spelling, and other school-related skills; and

WHEREAS, such primary and secondary impacts diminish future

independence and employment opportunities if not resolved or

improved; and

WHEREAS, it is important to generate greater public awareness of CAS in

Vermont among community members, physicians, education

professionals, policy makers, and elected officials; and

WHEREAS, Vermont recognizes these children, as well as their families,

for their effort, determination and resilience in the face of such

obstacles.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Philip B. Scott, Governor, hereby proclaim May 14, 2019 as

APRAXIA AWARENESS DAY

in Vermont.
