WHEREAS, these relatives care for children, often in unplanned circumstances, and assume the responsibilities of being parents which makes a big impact on everyone's lives; and


WHEREAS, it takes a village to raise children, and with the help of community collaborators, kinship caregivers can continue to raise and support children in Vermont.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Philip B. Scott, Governor, hereby proclaim September 21-25, 2020 as


