WHEREAS, the League of Women Voters reminds our citizens that democracy depends on their participation, through voting and being informed on issues.


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Philip B. Scott, Governor, hereby proclaim February 14, 2020 as


LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS DAY
