WHEREAS, Vermont has no military bases for our military children and youth

to form connections, and therefore, can be invisible to coaches,

teachers, and the community; and

WHEREAS, military personnel are relocated frequently, and moving can result

in both academic and social challenges for the children of military

personnel; and

WHEREAS, regardless of their grade, military children entering a new school

system must adjust to different and possibly incompatible curriculums, become acquainted with new surroundings, and form

new friendships; and

WHEREAS, the Vermont National Guard has implemented and promotes the

Vermont National Guard Child and Youth Program in accordance

with instructions from the National Guard Bureau; and

WHEREAS. Vermont is one of the states that has ratified the Interstate Compact

on Educational Opportunity for Military Children to address the

academic impacts of military children's frequent relocations; and

WHEREAS, the Vermont National Guard Child and Youth program assists

Vermont's military youth with adjusting to situations other children do not experience and serves as a resource for the broader community, educating communities on the effect of parental

deployments for our military children; and

WHEREAS, for 2019, the Vermont National Guard Child & Youth program

reported 593.5 programming hours were provided with 38 day and overnight experiences which focus on increasing Peer-to-Peer Connection, building Leadership and Resilience skills, that reached 1,778 Army and Air National Guard dependent youth, and 6 Educate the Educator awareness briefings provided to a total of 133

professionals engaged in youth development; and

WHEREAS, military parents whose children participate in the Vermont National

Guard Child and Youth Program have responded favorably to its

impact on their children's lives.
