A Proclamation**


- WHEREAS,** the catastrophic injury or death of a parent or guardian can have a devastating emotional and financial impact on any family; and
- WHEREAS,** when the injury or death results from a work-related accident, workers' compensation benefits are often insufficient to allow the injured or deceased worker's children to pursue their educational goals; and
- WHEREAS,** Kids' Chance of Vermont was incorporated in June 2014 as a nonprofit organization to provide educational scholarships to young Vermonters whose mothers or fathers have suffered serious, catastrophic or fatal workplace injuries or illnesses; and
- WHEREAS,** Kids' Chance of Vermont believes that access to higher education ensures our state's young people have the knowledge and skills to be successful in the workplace, provide for their families and make a difference in their communities; and
- WHEREAS,** Kids' Chance of Vermont has provided more than \$120,000 in scholarships in the seven years since its inception, helping Vermont students attend college, university, vocational and trade programs; and
- WHEREAS,** November 8-12, 2021 has been designated Kids' Chance Awareness Week in order to increase the visibility of Kids' Chance organizations throughout the United States and to inform others about Kids' Chance scholarship opportunities.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Philip B. Scott, Governor, hereby proclaim November 8-12, 2021 as


