A Proclamation**

WHEREAS, the Vermont Medical Reserve Corps is made up of nine units in regions throughout the state, with a current total of 1,038 volunteers; and

WHEREAS, the Vermont Medical Reserve Corps quickly stepped forward to serve their communities by supporting the state's pandemic vaccination mission; and

WHEREAS, the Vermont Medical Reserve Corps fulfilled over 6,000 volunteer shifts in support Vermont's COVID-19 response by making workplace outbreak response calls, assisting with general public educational training outreach, and in other roles; and

WHEREAS, Vermont Medical Reserve Corps volunteers contributed over 27,000 hours in support of Vermont's COVID-19 response; and

WHEREAS, Vermont Medical Reserve Corps volunteers contributed over 23,000 hours primarily in support of Vermont's COVID-19 vaccination mission and response in 2021 alone; and

WHEREAS, Vermont total volunteer service during the state's COVID-19 response equates to a monetary value of over \$1.1 million to date; and

WHEREAS, Vermont could not have successfully responded to the pandemic without the support of Vermont Medical Reserve Corps volunteers; and

WHEREAS, the dedication, willingness and resilience exhibited by these volunteers during the COVID-19 pandemic is recognized and deeply valued; and


WHEREAS, in 2021, the Vermont Medical Reserve Corps celebrated their 20th anniversary supporting community preparedness and response.

MONTH**


