WHEREAS, the residents of the Town of Weybridge, Vermont Old Cemetery

Association and the Vermont Society Sons of the American Revolution have endeavored to preserve the history of the Weybridge, Brittle Azra Stow Cemetery that held the remains of Revolutionary War Soldiers, Josiah Clark and William Havens; and

WHEREAS, it is recognized that the Revolutionary War soldiers, Joshua Clark

> and William Havens who fought at the Battle of Bunker Hill, and the excavation of their remains was necessary to protect their mortal remains from vanishing from the Weybridge Stow gravesite; and

WHEREAS, we owe our Revolutionary War soldiers a debt of gratitude which

includes preserving the graves and monuments of these patriots and

their families: and

WHEREAS, we have endeavored to preserve and protect the historic significance

of these burials and it is recognized that the reburials were necessary

to honor and preserve the memory of these veterans; and

WHEREAS, these grounds, known as the First Weybridge Cemetery, will

> become the final resting place of the recovered Weybridge Revolutionary War heroes, Josiah Clark and William Haven and

their families; and

cooperation between the residents, local government, and Vermont WHEREAS,

organizations has resulted in the preservation of the remains and

monuments of this historic Vermont burial ground.

FIRST WEYBRIDGE CEMETERY DAY

in Vermont.
