A Proclamation**

WHEREAS, the annual observance of the National Day of Prayer will be held on Thursday, May 5, 2022; and

WHEREAS, throughout the history of America, faith has been deeply rooted in the foundation, building and continuous improvement of this free Nation; and

WHEREAS, from the indigenous populations of North America to the first European settlers and immigrants to present day, the spiritual guidance, faith, reverence, human decency, humility, and tolerance found in prayer has led many Americans and indeed our Nation through times of both great crisis, difficult reconciliations, and jubilant celebration; and

WHEREAS, a National Day of Prayer has been a tradition since it was declared by the First Continental Congress in 1775, later reaffirmed in 1952 by a Joint Resolution of the U.S. Congress; and

WHEREAS, it was made law in 1988, establishing the first Thursday of May annually as a National Day of Prayer; and


WHEREAS, Americans have a fundamental right to religious freedom and prayer can help unify our hearts – and therefore our communities and our country.

DAY OF PRAYER


in Vermont.
