**WHEREAS,** Vermont is pleased to celebrate Correctional Officers Week and is urging all Vermonters to pay special tribute to these women and men who serve so faithfully.


**NOW, THEREFORE,** I, Philip B. Scott, Governor, hereby proclaim May 1-7, 2022 as


