## State of Vermont Executive Department A Proclamation

WHEREAS, Vermont has a rich and storied tradition of hunting and angling, that

dates back further than the state itself and carries forward to this day;

and

WHEREAS, Vermont sportsmen and women were among the first

conservationists to support the establishment of Vermont Fish and Wildlife Department to conserve fish, wildlife and their habitat, and through their license fees helped fund state efforts to provide for

healthy and sustainable natural resources; and

**WHEREAS**, the Vermont Fish and Wildlife Department is funded primarily by

sportsmen and women, through this American System of Conservation Funding - a "user pays - public benefits" approach that is widely recognized as the most successful model of fish and

wildlife management in the world; and

WHEREAS, Vermont's sportsmen and women generated \$15.6 million through

this System in 2018 to support the conservation efforts of the

Vermont Fish and Wildlife Department; and

WHEREAS, Vermont's 164,000 hunters and anglers support our economy by

spending more than \$440 million while engaged in their pursuits, supporting nearly 7,000 jobs and generating nearly \$50 million in

state and local tax revenue; and

WHEREAS, National Hunting and Fishing Day was established in 1972 by

Congress to celebrate and recognize hunters and anglers for their immense contributions to fish and wildlife conservation, and to our

society.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** I, Philip B. Scott, Governor, hereby proclaim September 28, 2019

as
