WHEREAS, Sudden Unexplained Death in Childhood (SUDC) is a category of death in children

between the ages of 1 and 18 that remains unexplained after a thorough

investigation, including an autopsy; and

WHEREAS, each year there are approximately 400 cases of SUDC in the United States -

including more than 200 younger children between the ages of 1 and 4 - who die

without any clear cause or explanation; and

WHEREAS, while less common than sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS), which occurs before

the first birthday, SUDC is an important health concern deserving of increased

public awareness and research; and

WHEREAS, there currently is no way to predict or prevent SUDC as its cause is unknown; and

it is hoped that future research will identify means by which SUDC can be WHEREAS,

prevented; and

WHEREAS, we recognize the dedicated efforts of organizations such as the SUDC Foundation,

> medical professionals, medicolegal death investigators and volunteers who are working to better understand the causes of SUDC, improve the health of infants and children and provide much-needed hope and support for those families grieving the

heartbreaking sudden, unexplained death of a child; and

WHEREAS, Sudden Unexplained Death in Childhood Awareness Month provides an opportunity

> to honor the memory of the young lives that ended too soon, show encouragement and support for the families and loved ones devastated by their loss and increase

public awareness of SUDC and the ongoing search for answers.

SUDDEN UNEXPLAINED DEATH IN CHILDHOOD **AWARENESS MONTH**
