## State of Vermont Executive Department A Proclamation

WHEREAS, Fabry disease is a progressive, destructive, inherited disorder that

causes children and adults to experience many symptoms that diminish their quality of life and may lead to premature death in

adults due to strokes, kidney failure, and heart failure; and

WHEREAS, Fabry disease is caused by deficient activity of the lysosomal

enzyme alpha-galactosidase A that results in buildup of lipids in the

body causing cell and organ damage; and

WHEREAS, there are two approved treatments available but because the disease

> is severely under-diagnosed, many people live without an accurate diagnosis or opportunity for treatment until after irreversible organ

damage occurs; and

WHEREAS, newborn screening has now been performed in several countries,

> yielding a prevalence ranging from 1:1,368 to 1:8,882. This is in contrast to earlier presumed prevalence of 1:40,000-1:117,000; and

health care providers and families should be aware of the many WHEREAS,

> Fabry disease symptoms and if warranted, obtain a GLA gene test that can definitively assess the presence of this treatable disorder.
