section 102 of title 36, United States Code, officially designates WHEREAS, May as Asian and Pacific American Heritage Month; and WHEREAS, Asian and Pacific Americans have played important and essential roles throughout American and Vermont's history; and WHEREAS, May 18 is the birthday of Vincent Chin, a Chinese-American man who was brutally murdered in a hate crime in 1982. His murder has fueled an important national movement to raise awareness about anti-Asian violence: and WHEREAS, Vermont celebrates its residents and visitors of Asian and Pacific Island heritage, and has welcomed a 54% increase in the AAPI Vermonter population as reflected in the 2020 United States Census; and WHEREAS. in April 2022, Vermont was honored to see the newest Justice of the Supreme Court of the State of Vermont sworn in, who is a person of Asian descent and the first woman of color to serve on the bench in Vermont: and WHEREAS, Vermont is committed to being a welcoming and inclusive place where all residents and visitors are safe to live, work, and play; and in the month of May, Vermonters celebrate the accomplishments of WHEREAS, our Asian and Pacific American neighbors and community members and condemn the bullying, discrimination, and hate crimes they have and may face. NOW, THEREFORE, I, Philip B. Scott, Governor, hereby proclaim May 2022 as ASIAN AMERICAN AND PACIFIC ISLANDER **HERITAGE MONTH** in Vermont.
