State of Vermont Executive Department A Proclamation

WHEREAS, Vermont recognizes February as Cholangiocarcinoma Awareness Month in

commemoration of all patients and caregivers impacted by this rare, lethal cancer; and

WHEREAS, cholangiocarcinoma starts in the bile duct, a thin tube, about four to five inches long, that

reaches from the liver to the small intestine; and

WHEREAS, there are two types of cholangiocarcinoma: intrahepatic and extrahepatic, and the

mortality rate has increased dramatically in the last decade; and

WHEREAS, an estimated 8,000 people in the United States develop cholangiocarcinoma each year,

and almost two out of three of those diagnosed are 65 or older when it is found; and

WHEREAS, patients are typically diagnosed at a late stage due to no validated early method of

detection and symptoms of jaundice, abdominal pain, itchy skin and weight loss do not

usually present till advanced disease progression; and

WHEREAS, the chances of survival for patients with bile duct cancer depends to a large extent on its

location and how advanced it is when it is found; and

WHEREAS, rare cancers have a five-year survival rate under 50% with the cholangiocarcinoma five-year

survival rate being approximately 20%; and

WHEREAS, there is currently no cure for cholangiocarcinoma, yet the FDA has approved durvalumab

(Imfinzi) creating a new standard of care for cholangiocarcinoma patients with the

combination of immunotherapy and chemotherapy; and

WHEREAS, foundations, research and teaching hospitals, rare cancer advocacy groups, and patient

advocacy groups from around the globe have joined forces to recognize February as

Cholangiocarcinoma Awareness Month; and

WHEREAS, increased cholangiocarcinoma advocacy, awareness, research, and education will bring

improved outcomes for patients in earlier detection and treatment and potential curative

methods.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Philip B. Scott, Governor, hereby proclaim February 2023 as

CHOLANGIOCARCINOMA AWARENESS MONTH

in Vermont.
