WHEREAS, substance use disorder, mental health needs and co-occurring

conditions affect millions of individuals as well as their families and

friends; and

WHEREAS, Vermont continues to see increasing rates of alcohol attributable

deaths, fatal opioid overdose deaths, and death by suicide; and

WHEREAS, people living with these conditions need help and hope, including a

community that supports them, their families, and their recovery;

and

WHEREAS, Recovery Vermont coaches, centers, and other staff provide

lifesaving supports in Vermont; and

WHEREAS, the health, well-being, and quality of life of some Vermonters are

impacted by chronic, yet treatable, health conditions, which can be exacerbated by inequitable access to safe, affordable housing, food, transportation, childcare, and other social determinants of health;

and

WHEREAS, Vermont's "Recovery Day" is designed to remind all Vermonters

that substance use disorder, mental health needs, and co-occurring conditions respond well to proper and timely interventions, including the support from peers who have had successful recovery

experiences; and

WHEREAS, support for Recovery Vermont systems means recovery is not just

possible but probable for all Vermonters.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Philip B. Scott, Governor, hereby proclaim February 15, 2023 as

RECOVERY DAY

in Vermont.
