WHEREAS, access to childhood healthcare is vital to the well-being of all children, but 20.3

million children in the United States face barriers to accessing healthcare; and

WHEREAS, those barriers to healthcare may take the form of financial or non-financial hardships,

11.5 million American children's families report difficulty in paying medical bills;

and

WHEREAS, non-financial barriers to childhood healthcare include lack of car or poor public

transportation, living within a federally designated Health Professional Shortage

Area, or informational barriers such as parental literacy; and

WHEREAS, 14 million American children live in Health Professional Shortage Areas; and

WHEREAS, only 46.7% of Vermont children received routine developmental screening by a

healthcare provider between the ages of 0-3 and Vermont is ranked fourth in the

nation overall; and

WHEREAS, 1.9% of Vermont children, or 2,222 individuals, do not have health insurance and

Vermont is ranked second nationally; and

WHEREAS, insurance coverage alone does not guarantee access to healthcare, and the Winooski

School District runs a school-based health clinic for students in coordination with the UVM Children's Hospital and Community Health Center of Burlington; and

WHEREAS. children with the opportunity to see healthcare providers without leaving school will

be more likely to receive the care they need; and

WHEREAS, access to routine childhood healthcare affects not just children, but also their parents'

daily schedules; and

WHEREAS, Vermont Childhood Healthcare Accessibility Month will encourage awareness of

school-based healthcare programs.
