WHEREAS, ongoing cleaning, disinfecting, and infection-prevention best practices are essential

to promoting human health, and workplace cleanliness enhances employee

productivity and customer satisfaction; and

**WHEREAS,** cleanliness reduces instances of absenteeism that negatively impact productivity –

the 2016 flu season cost U.S. businesses an estimated \$5.8 billion in healthcare and

lost productivity expenses; and

**WHEREAS,** according to ISSA, the world's leading trade association for the cleaning industry,

cleaned and disinfected surfaces reduce virus concentration by 41.7%. When

combined with hand hygiene, this increases to 85.4%; and

WHEREAS, manufacturers and distributors produce and deliver crucial cleaning and hygiene

products; and

**WHEREAS**, essential frontline cleaning professionals work tirelessly to keep our schools,

hospitals, workplaces, and other spaces healthy and safe for us all; and

**WHEREAS.** Vermonters proudly support and bring attention to the importance of ensuring clean

and sanitary conditions at work, in schools, and at home.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** I, Philip B. Scott, Governor, hereby proclaim March 24 – 30, 2024 as
