WHEREAS, Vermont has a long-standing tradition of upholding the dignity of the individual,

supporting legal equality and fair treatment for all people regardless of sexual orientation or gender identity, and ensuring acts of discrimination and hatred will not

be tolerated; and

WHEREAS, members of the LGBTQ+ community contribute to our state's success and strengths

in a great number of immeasurable ways; and

WHEREAS, Vermont held its first Pride March on June 25, 1983; and

WHEREAS, in 2009, Vermont was the first state in the union to legalize same-sex civil unions,

paving the way for further progress, and providing more rights and visibility to the

LGBTQ+ community of Vermont; and

WHEREAS. Vermont acknowledges and condemns the violence, harassment, and discrimination

imposed upon LGBTQ+ individuals and groups, yet these communities are able to thrive through the support of LGBTQ+ affirming spaces, agencies, and individual

allies; and

WHEREAS, Vermont remains committed to supporting LGBTQ+ families, LGBTQ+ children,

transgender athletes, and LGBTQ+ students; and

WHEREAS, Vermont has positioned itself as a safe place for LGBTQ+ people with expanded

protections for all; and

WHEREAS. all Vermonters are welcome to join the LGBTO+ community during the month of

June in celebrating the resiliency and contributions of these Vermonters.
